Harrisburg Mission Team

Only days after a deadly tornado slashed through Harrisburg, Illinois killing seven, determined Christians left there for Hikiwan Arizona to honor their commitment to minister to Native Americans. It was the most deadly Southern Illinois storm since 1982

One couple had already left for Arizona in their RV. They waited in route to hear if their home had been spared and to find if the rest of the team planned to continue with their flight plans.

One young lady on the team lived with her grandmother. Their home was destroyed but she was



not at home and though her grandmother had to be pulled out of the debris, she was not seriously injured. The rest were spared from the tornado's wrath.

More powerful than the storm was the spiritual seed that was planted by the actions of the team

while they were at Christ Fellowship Community Church in Hikiwan. Seed that ultimately sprouted over the next few weeks. ...Not fully known if direct or indirect, but five have since been baptized at Hikiwan.

Very importantly, the team repaired, repainted, and reinstalled a sign at the entrance of the church. It is one of the few signs that exists on the reservation.

...Like a Mighty Wind

When your calling is to hold up the arms of Believers in discipleship, patience is likely to be tested. The bottom line is that "they who wait upon the Lord can mount up on wings as eagles."

Just a few weeks ago...surprisingly it was after the first one of the young people at the church had made a profession of faith in Christ...I digressed to make what I thought was an "honest" assessment of our five years on the rez. I should have realized that what I was feeling was actually "doubt" disguised in the form of "assessment." I guess I wondered if we were really accomplishing any thing.

But I heard that "still small voice." His Spirit said to my heart, "I know that you really are not hung up on numbers as so many of my workers are." "But let me show you some numbers anyway...remember its not just the Indian Believers whose arms you are holding up, its also other missionaries for whom you are providing assistance, encouragement, and logistics."

Like a gentle breeze blowing the petals of a flower, I began recalling precious ones who, over the last couple of months had surrendered their will to Christ. In addition to the five young people at Christ Fellowship Community Church, there were four at Sacaton, then five on Pastor Pete's evangelism tour.

Eddie told of four baptisms at Sells, then seven more received Christ in Eric and Brittany's brand new North-side work in Chui Chu. Like a mighty wind the Holy Spirit is moving among Native Americans.

Late last year, a man called to tell of how God had called their Texas church to find a way to reach an "unreached people group" who are related to the people we work with. Indian

friends helped us do research and we found that such a ministry venture would be likely to be very dangerous. We cannot tell where the location is. I have expressed to people that no one should go in there without a "Water on fleece" calling from God.

We put him in contact with someone who works in the general area. They adjusted their itinerary to include introducing him to pastors on the other side of the area. An impromptu revival service erupted, producing I believe, nineteen decisions for Christ. In the following days, the pastors' follow-up yielded ten more.

A few weeks later on another trip there, twenty were saved in one location and thirty in another... Like a mighty wind...

Thurleen and I had nothing to do with reaching most of these new converts...or did we?
