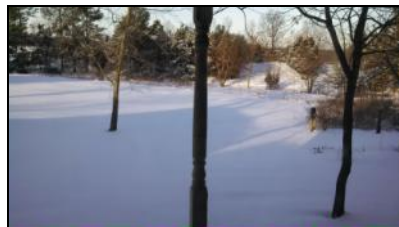

Back to the Reservation

Our recent trip from Illinois to the Arizona Indian country is the 23rd such trek back and forth across the country. Each trip has a history of its own. We have dodged tornados and struggled every trip to keep tires and wheels on our trailer. Once, God parted the storm filled clouds away from our path five times...and we drove all the way on dry pavement!

We try to leave Illinois soon after our family Thanksgiving/Christmas in November, but we were delayed and got caught by ice and snow and had a window of only a few hours before the long country



driveway would become so muddy that the heavy rolling teepee would be trapped for the duration. Then in Little Rock a very difficult night driving maneuver put the corner of the 5th wheel just a half inch too close to the back window of the truck. To add trauma to the drama, the tempered glass window went off like a shotgun!

Just have to remember that when we are plagued with little “issues,” it usually means that we can expect that God has big blessings in store. Since we had to wait at our son’s house in Dallas for replacement air springs to arrive, it didn’t take a lot of persuasion to stay a little longer to celebrate Christmas with our Texas branch of the family.

We had to hurry to Hikiwan to be back before a Jackson Hole, Wyoming mission team would arrive. What a blessing it is to facilitate successive mission teams and see a gradual layering of gospel truth on the hearts of the kids and now the adults in the Indian

AFTER the team left, on January 5, FIVE children and THREE adults stepped up, willing to sign that they wanted to receive Christ and to be baptized in believer’s baptism.

A team from Kentucky poured concrete and erected framing. Another from Iowa built a fine ramada. Volunteers from Sells and Gary and Ken roofed the home. Over the Holidays the Wyoming team completed insulation and began drywall installation. The team held a bible club for Hikiwan kids each day. On New Year's Eve, Leader Tim built an innovative outdoor pizza oven to the joy of everyone who stuffed themselves



with pizza.



Pastor Gary Ramer was describing the project at a family gathering. His son-in-law, Doug Currie, a deacon at Trinity Baptist church in Casa Grande suggested that perhaps their men's group could take the project on as a mission outreach. We are told that the people of the church enthusiastically took up the challenge to be a blessing to their neighbors on the reservation. Doug brought his pastor and eight men to Charco 27 to see the project. The Wyoming team was still working. I was deeply touched that they were able to "transition" the work in the name of Jesus to the men of Trinity. The groups are pictured together:



It's really not about building a house. It's about the expression of the love of Christ in action. Believe me, though we may not see *them*, the people of Charco village will not miss noticing a single thing that *we* do. May it all be in the name of Christ. To think we could build a house, and see it done in a year is truly a miracle.

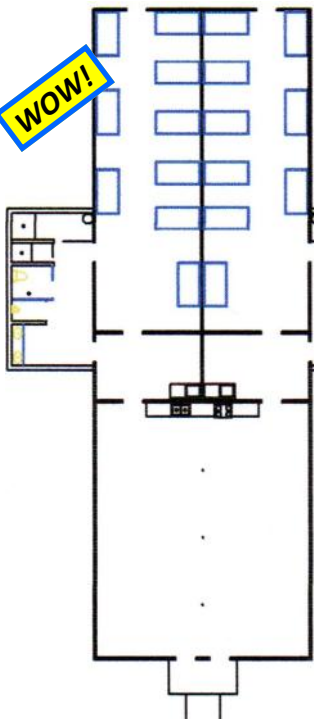
A New Hikiwan Mission House!!!!

Last year when the contractor stopped by and said, "I've got something good for you," I knew God was up to something. The large trusses could build a new mission house.

But Lord, that's impossible, we wanted to say. But we're learning that He *is* a God of miracles. **There are THREE mission teams coming to build it starting in March.**

It will house at least 30 missionaries with bunks, rest rooms, and showers. As a multipurpose building, it will provide kitchen facilities as well as adjustable classrooms.

Perhaps our brainstorming about having a place where our Indian neighbors can learn some vocational skills wasn't so far out. Perhaps it will be a place where all sorts of new realms of ministry can take place!
